"To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven." Ecclesiastes 3:1

I've been thinking lately about seasons and purposes and the mysteries of God. The bad news/good news is: All things change--except God! He promises us that all seasons have a beginning and an end. In Genesis 8:22, God spoke to Noah and said that, "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, winter and summer, day and night, shall not cease." God designed and framed the world so that we would live our lives constantly moving out of one season and into the next. Today we are experiencing blazing heat, lush flowers, and fruitful crops; soon we will welcome chilly nights and turning leaves as fall arrives. While some seasons bring weeping, others bring joy; some seasons bring war, while others bring peace, but each season is temporary, and brings with it an element of change and hidden purpose, according to God's design.

God gives me hope and expectation that with Him difficult conditions are always subject to change and transformation." May these words guide us in the coming days, weeks and years. I am certain that God has good things planned for each of us and for Mount Olive Presbyterian church.
